REQUIRED COURSES AND CRUCIAL INFORMATION:

- Prerequisites do not count toward the major/minor. Students must take at least one course from each of the 4 categories of required courses. Additional courses from each category of required courses will be counted as electives.
- The capstone series (FR 500/501) must be taken in residence and cannot be replaced by transfer credit or another course—this is a University-level requirement.
- Note also that students may take a maximum of 2 courses (major) and 1 course (minor) in English, and related to French/Francophone culture and literature, toward their French degree, including courses in the required categories.
- Students may take a maximum of two online courses with an FR code toward degree completion. Other online courses, *with approval of an advisor*, may be counted toward the degree as electives, with a maximum of 2 additional courses for the majors and 1 additional course for the minors.
- Finally, students who plan to study abroad may earn a maximum of 50% of their upper-division coursework toward the major (15 units) or minor (10.5 units). All units taken abroad will count toward the undergraduate degree at SFSU, but only 50% may count toward the major or minor, meaning that one half of the upper division courses must be taken in residence at SF State.
- Very advanced undergraduates in excellent standing, who have completed all the
 available undergraduate coursework and one or more of the capstone courses in
 French may enroll in graduate seminars with the permission of the instructor.
